The Mill Creek School offers a full academic schedule for students in grades seven through twelve designed to challenge students with all levels of intellect. Youth who face anxiety, depression, trauma and other mental or emotional challenges are provided emotional support from specialized staff. Individualized curriculum provided through a low student/teacher ratio ensures students' academic and emotional needs are met.
